## Instructions to participants for the interlaboratory study PAA from polyamide kitchenware iis20X20

- \* Please **confirm sample receipt** as soon as you have received this package and checked the contents, via the data entry portal <a href="www.kpmd.co.uk/sgs-iis-cts/">www.kpmd.co.uk/sgs-iis-cts/</a>. Please give date of receipt and press the "Save Date" button. - \* This interlaboratory study concerns 1 sample of kitchenware, 1x nylon soup spoon with stainless steel handle labelled #20635 for the determination of PAA. Please be aware that in daily practise you will receive more items for testing. Please understand that this sample is positive and specially prepared for the proficiency test. This means that 1 item of the sample is sufficient for the determination of PAA.
- \* The migration method for the soup spoon is immersion (please see table below). You can check the test scope in round iis20X20 via <a href="https://www.kpmd.co.uk/sgs-iis-cts/">www.kpmd.co.uk/sgs-iis-cts/</a>.

Please take care to use the following fixed test conditions during this PT.

Simulant	3% M/V Acetic Acid
Exposure time	2 hours
Exposure temperature	100°C
Migration method	immersion
Simulant volume	as per method used (please report volume)

These fixed test conditions are originated from the guidelines EUR 24815 EN 2011 'Technical guidelines on testing the migration of primary aromatic amines from polyamide kitchenware and of formaldehyde from melamine kitchenware' which can be downloaded for free via https://publications.jrc.ec.europa.eu/repository/bitstream/JRC64903/lbna24815enn.pdf

\* Please treat the sample **as if it was a routine sample** and analyze it in the way you normally do in day-to-day circumstances with in mind the fixed test conditions mentioned in the table above.

## \* Reporting of test results:

Within a time frame of five weeks test results can be entered or revised. Please report your test results via <a href="https://www.kpmd.co.uk/sgs-iis-cts/">www.kpmd.co.uk/sgs-iis-cts/</a>. It is not necessary to enter all test results in one session. Within the time frame you can add (or delete) test results and/or change test results or units. Please **do not forget** to hit the "Save/Submit" button after entering the test results. Please note that you will get a pop up to say that you have submitted your test results. You can check if your test results have been saved by logging out and logging in again. When your test results are still present it means that everything is OK and that your test results are received in good order.

On the report page is a column, titled "reference method". In case a method is mentioned in this column, it will be used for the calculation of the z-scores. It is of utmost importance to know that it is **not mandatory** to use this 'reference method' as test method. Please select the method that you used from the picklist under "Actual Method Used". When your method is not listed here, please select "Other" and write the method that you used in the comments.

Please report the test results using the indicated units. It is possible to report in the last column the test results rounded in accordance with the test method that was used and in the first result column the same test results but less rounded. Please note that it is not mandatory to report both 'rounded' and 'unrounded' test results. The 'unrounded' test results are preferably used for our statistical evaluations. However the 'rounded' test results will be used in case the 'unrounded' test results are not reported. We suggest to report extra significant figures in order to give more meaningful statistical evaluations. For example, when you found a test result of 79.17 mg/kg we request you to report 79.17 as 'unrounded' test result and or 79.2 µg/L as "rounded" test result.

It is also requested not to report 'less than' test results, which are above the detection limit, because such test results cannot be used for meaningful statistical evaluations.

To get more background of the analytical method we asked some additional questions. Please, complete these questions as much as possible. It will help us to evaluate the results of the proficiency test. Thank you in advance.
